- Entries will close July 5 at 5pm. Entries may be made after that day by paying double the normal fees. Entries will not be received after 11am on Friday, July 20. Only entries received before the July 5 deadline will be listed on the show program. IF FIVE PAID ENTRIES IN ONE BREED HAVE NOT BEEN RECEIVED BY THE ENTRY DEADLINE, LIVESTOCK WILL BE REQUIRED TO SHOW IN THE OTHER BREEDS DIVISION.
- Barns will be locked until 5am on Tuesday, July 24. No early arrivals or releases. Those wishing to arrive at times other than those listed must contact the ND State Fair office: 701-857-7620. Any requests for early release must be approved by the ND State Fair Board.

UPDATED HEALTH REGULATIONS:

- **Before unloading livestock:** All animals must be inspected prior to unloading. Unloading must occur between 6am and midnight. If exhibitors are planning to arrive prior to 7am or after 10pm, they may wish to call in advance to ensure that one of the state veterinarians is on the grounds when they arrive, except on Tuesday, when someone will already be on the grounds at 6am. Contact numbers for each date will be available from species superintendents and will be posted at the veterinary inspection tent during the Fair. Animals should NOT be unloaded directly into the tie-out area before they are inspected by the state veterinarian on duty.
 - * A change in cattle identification requirements due to the animal disease traceability rule (9CFR Part 86) went into effect March 11, 2013. All cattle moved interstate for exhibition regardless of age or sexual status must be officially identified with a USDA tag or 840 series RFID tag. A certificate of veterinary inspection and importation permit number from the ND State Board of Animal Health are also required for out of state cattle. Dairy cattle from out of state must also test negative for tuberculosis. For more information, see "Health Requirements" section.
- Registered, identified, and grade animals allowed. Registration papers must be available for review. Registration, DHIA or other records must be used for group class entries; the honor system will be used for birth dates in single animal classes for grade animals if papers are not available.
- The entry fee is \$5 per head in single animal Classes; \$5 per group in multiple animal classes. Tack stalls (5 feet wide) are \$10 each. Stalls will be forfeited if the number of animals entered requires additional room for stalling. Canadian exhibitors at par for entry fees, compliments of ND State Fair. Specify special stalling needs on entry forms. Late entries will have no stall guarantees.
- Straw will be available for purchase.
- Due to limited space in the West Lot, livestock trailers will be required to park off grounds. Tow vehicle can park in West Lot with appropriate pass and providing there is space available. Vehicle passes must be purchased in advance of the first day of Fair, and will not be available for purchase at the gate. Please order on the entry blank. Livestock vehicles will be allowed on the grounds between 8pm and 10am. No admittance between 10am and 8pm except for unloading or loading of livestock.
- Superintendents will stall cattle in the barns upon receipt of entry fees and veterinarian approval.
- All animals shown in group or herd classes must be entered in single animal classes. Premiums will be paid on only 2 entries per class. When making entries, be sure to list breed of animal. Animals must be exhibited under the officially recorded owner's name or farm name.
- Minimum milk collection facilities and equipment will be provided. Note: there is no market for milk produced during this event, so no revenues will be paid for milk collected. Nonetheless, the public is watching, so be sure to use best management practices as if the milk was being collected for food use. All exhibitors using these facilities are expected to keep the area and equipment spotless.
- Fan Policy: no fans or fan stands of any type will be allowed in the barn aisles.
- The Herdsman Award, awarded to an exhibitor of dairy cattle, is based on neatness and general appearance of the exhibit, as well as the exhibitor's cooperation and courtesy throughout the exhibition period.

- 1. Entries close July 13 at 1pm. Late entries may be requested after that deadline, but the entry fees double (\$10 per head).
- 2. Note: Entry fees are \$5 per head and MUST accompany all pre-registration entry forms. This includes a \$5 fee for each group class entered. Entry forms are available electronically from www.ndstatefair.com. If showing multiple breeds, please register each breed on separate forms.
- 3. Note: No limit on the number of entries in any one class from any one exhibitor. Premium payout will be issued up to the first six places regardless of the number of entries per class.
- **4.** No stall fee (in addition to the State Fair fee) is required, but stall space is subject to forfeiture if additional stalls are required for show animals. In lieu of stall fees, all exhibitors are required to purchase a daily gate pass.
- 5. Eligibility: North Dakota breeders only. Registered and breed approved identified (I.E.) cattle. No grade or crossbreed animals allowed. Proof of ownership shall accompany the registration certificate and be presented at registration prior to show. Registration and I.E. identification must accompany all animals. If registration is not in hand, breed association evidence of ownership and identity of animal must accompany these exhibits. DHIA or other records are also required for certain classes.
- **6.** Animals must be exhibited under the breed association's officially recorded owner or farm name.
- 7. All animals entered in group classes must have been registered and exhibited in the appropriate individual classes. State Dairy Show breed divisions and classes are listed in this document.
- **8.** Syndicated or **partnership** cows must be owned by North Dakota breeders. Exception, if partially owned by out of state interests, exhibitor must provide evidence of enrollment in a North Dakota DHIA testing program. Syndicate animals must have a letter from the Breeders Association stating all owners of the exhibit.
- **9. Substitution:** A previously entered animal may be replaced by a substitution in the **same** division, but only if the substitution is made on or before entry day and owned by the exhibitor.
- 10. Refunds: No refunds issued for animals scratched after printing of show catalogues, on entry day, or during the show.
- 11. Animal health regulation and well-being: Refer to General Livestock Health Requirements.
- 12. Minimum milk collection facilities and equipment will be provided. Note: There is **no market** for milk produced during this event, so no revenues will be paid for milk collected. Nonetheless, the public is watching, so be sure to use best management practices as if the milk was being collected for food use. All exhibitors using these facilities are expected to keep the area and equipment spotless.
- 13. Since this event does NOT include a youth show, youth are encouraged to compete in State Fair, 4-H or FFA events. However, no additional State Dairy Show premium will be issued to youth to supplement 4-H/FFA placing.
- 14. Release: Early release by special arrangement only. See Fair Management for arrangements. Any animals leaving before official release time will forfeit all premiums, no exceptions.
- 15. Note: All barns are locked and secured according to ND State Fair regulations, listed elsewhere in the book, sorry no exceptions.
