- **Entries will close July 5 at 5pm.** Entries may be made after that day by paying double the normal fees. Under no circumstances will entries be received after Noon on Friday, July 21.
- All goats must be penned by 11am Tuesday, July 25. Open class goats may not arrive prior to 6pm Monday unless prior arrangements have been made with Fair Management. Removal of goats before 6pm on the closing day of the Fair will result in forfeiture of all premiums unless given permission in writing by the Fair.
- **No early arrivals or releases.** Those wishing to arrive or depart on other times than those listed must contact the ND State Fair office: 701-857-7620. Any requests for early release must be approved by the ND State Fair Board.

UPDATED HEALTH REGULATIONS:

- **Before unloading livestock:** All animals must be inspected prior to unloading. Unloading must occur between 6am and midnight. If exhibitors are planning to arrive prior to 7am or after 10pm, they may wish to call in advance to ensure that one of the state veterinarians is on the grounds when they arrive, except on Tuesday, when someone will already be on the grounds at 6am. Contact numbers for each date will be available from species superintendents and will be posted at the veterinary inspection tent during the fair. Animals should NOT be unloaded directly into the tie-out area before they are inspected by the state veterinarian on duty.
- * **Out-of-state goats** will need certificate of veterinary inspection. All goats that come to the Fair, with the exception of market wether goats, must have official scrapie identification tags. For goat breeds approved by USDA-APHIS-VS, a 'breed registration tattoo' will be accepted in lieu of a scrapie tag, provided the tattoo is legible and the exhibitor presents a copy of the registration papers listing the current owner. Goats from the former TB management zone in Minnesota must test negative for tuberculosis within 60 days prior to importation
- * **Additional requirements for Dairy Breed Goats:** All sexually intact dairy breed goats must test negative for Brucellosis and tuberculosis within 30 days prior to importation. For more information, see "Health Requirements" section.
- * Each animal must have its identification number listed on the health papers. It is not acceptable to list: "32 head of goats – all free of disease." List each animal separately.
- Base date for age is Sept. 1. Only two entries in the individual rings and one in the groups will be accepted from any exhibitor. Premiums are paid on only 2 entries per class. Any class containing over 24 head shall be split by birthdate.
- All animals must have association registration papers. Photocopies will not be accepted. All registration papers must be presented when the animals are checked in at the Expo Barn Office. Animals must be exhibited in the officially recorded owner's name. Get of Sire to be listed under one person's name, even though the animals may be owned by other individuals.
- The entry fee is **\$3 per class.** Canadian friends at par for entry fees, compliments of Visit Minot. Specify special stalling needs on entry forms. Late entries will have no stall guarantees. No exhibitor will be granted a "tack stall" until all animals are housed and if room is available.
- **Fan Policy:** No fans or fan stands of any type will be allowed in the barn aisles.
- **Herdsmen Award:** Awarded to an exhibitor of dairy goats and based on neatness and general appearance of exhibit and exhibitor's cooperation and courtesy throughout the exhibition period.
- **Due to limited space in the West Lot, livestock trailers will be required to park off grounds. Tow vehicle can park in West Lot with appropriate pass and providing there is space available.** Vehicle passes must be purchased in advance of the first day of Fair, and will not be available for purchase at the gate. Please order on the entry blank. Livestock vehicles will be allowed on the grounds between 8pm and 10am. No admittance between 10am and 8pm except for unloading or loading of livestock.
- This is an official ADGA sanctioned show and their rules shall govern. If you do not have a copy of Rules Governing the Conduct of Official Shows, write the North Dakota State Fair for a copy. This is a combined Jr/Sr Sanctioned Show. In order to make the show run smoothly, the show order is subject to change.
