<u>Deadline for entry form is July 6, 2024</u>. Open Class Plants & Flowers may be brought to 4-H Hall in the ND State Fair Center. There are two shows, beginning Friday, July 19 and Tuesday, July 23, to ensure fresh displays.

#### **ENTRY FEE:** None

#### **RULES ON ENTERING:**

- Entries must be listed on an official entry form by July 6. Due to our computer entry program, we encourage you to mail your entry form in early. There is also an online entry option that can be found on ndstatefair.com.
- Please clearly print name, address, department, division, and class on the entry form, as well as on the sample being exhibited. Exhibits cannot be accepted unless an entry blank is properly filled out and on file with the Fair Office prior to the closing date for entries.
- Only one entry may be made in any one class from any one family except for Any Other class, where exhibitors may enter three varieties or pots in this class.
- List variety and name. For size of planters, measure pot diameter at the top, edge to edge.
- Class numbers 1-102 are for the first show, class numbers 101-202 are for the second show.
- Blue ribbon winners of the First Show or members of the same farm or household may not re-enter that a same class for the Second Show. Also, if first show results in a ribbon, the same plant cannot be re-entered in the second show
- The superintendent in charge will see that all plants on exhibition are properly cared for during the time of the Fair, but will not be responsible for loss or injury.

#### RULES ON DROPPING OFF:

- Entry tags will be mailed in advance of the first show so exhibitor can tag their own exhibits.
- The Fair management is not bound to take entries made after 10:30am Thursday, July 18 for the first show and after 10:30am on Tuesday, July 23 for the second show.
- A gate pass for an auto, driver and one passenger, good for the necessary times and dates of entry and change-over only, will be provided. Abuse of this pass will result in discontinuation for 2024. Entries must be received by entry deadline to qualify for this pass.
- · Please enter the gate at the northwest end of the Fairgrounds; you may deliver and pick-up your entries through the FFA Hall.

#### JUDGING CRITERIA:

- Exhibitors must provide their own vases or other receptacles and place their exhibits in water or otherwise ensure their preservation. Foam only
  allowed in arrangements.
- No exhibitors allowed in the hall during judging.
- Authorized judges shall award ribbons and the decisions of these judges shall be final. Regardless of the number of entries in a division, prizes
  and ribbons will not be awarded to unworthy exhibits.
- One Best of Show ribbon will be awarded for each of the two shows.

#### **RULES ON PICKING UP:**

- All exhibits will become the property of the Fair unless claimed by 9 p.m. Saturday, July 27.
- Exhibitors are required to collect their own containers at the end of each show period in which they have exhibited.
- · All exhibits must remain in place for each show period. Ribbons must remain on exhibits during the entire show period

#### **SUGGESTIONS FOR DISPLAYING:**

- o Remove buds
- o May have attached foliage and sufficient stems
- o Count the flowers, and do not crowd the flowers
- o Keep petals out of water

- o Use the right height and width of container for the arrangement.
- o Lythrum is illegal: do not use in arrangements.
- o Outdoor planters may have other plants Lot 96-99 & 196-199
  - only.
