Rules and Regulations

- ALL GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE NORTH DAKOTA STATE FAIR listed in this Premium Book will apply except those governing specific breeds. Any issue or questions will be decided by the Show Committee.
- 2. NORTH DAKOTA STATE FAIR ASSOCIATION will not be responsible for any loss or damage or injury to horses exhibited, or for any article of any kind of nature that may be lost or destroyed, or in any way injured. Each exhibitor will be responsible for any injury that may be occasioned to any person, whomsoever, by any horse owned or exhibited by him or shall indemnify the Association, or any member thereof, against all claims and demands, of any kind or nature, that may grow out of any injury incurred by any horse owned or exhibited by them or arise from the negligence of the person in charge of any such horse. All horses exhibited in this show will be entirely at the owners risk.

The Fair Management reserves the right to make such change in procedure, personnel, rules and regulations as shall be deemed by them to be in the best interest of the show.

- 3. ENTRIES CLOSE: July 6, 2024.
- 4. ALL ENTRIES AND STALL FEES MUST ACCOMPANY ENTRY BLANK.
- 5. No refunds will be made unless a veterinary report is given to the Show Secretary <u>before</u> show time (entry fees only). Office fee of 20 percent will be deducted from the entry fee. All refunds will be mailed after the Fair.
- Checks returned constitute cancellation of the entry. NSF post entry checks disqualify an exhibitor from exhibiting the following year.
- 7. STALLS: Box Stalls (with doors) \$20 per night. Tack stalls \$20 per night.
- Stall assignments will be made as entries are received. Every effort will be made to accommodate exhibits. HOWEVER, IF STALLS ARE FILLED, OTHER ARRANGEMENTS WILL HAVE TO BE MADE. THE SHOW MANAGER WILL HELP IF POSSIBLE.
- Alleys and stalls must be cleaned by 9:00 a.m. each day and must be open to the public at all times. Your cooperation in keeping stalls and alleys clean is appreciated.
- It is required, if you can do so, that you decorate your stalls with your stable colors or other decoration to exhibit your animals while at the North Dakota State Fair.
- 11. Classes will be called promptly. First call when second class ahead enters ring; second call when preceding class enters ring; third call while ribbons are being awarded in the preceding class; two minutes will be allowed after first horse in class enters ring. In the interest of a fast moving show to hold spectator interest, the above procedure will be followed.
- 12. No person will be permitted to enter the arena except participants in the class, judges and their assistants, and the show photographer. Attendants will not be permitted in the arena until summoned by order of the judge.
- 13. It is the tradition of the show ring that riders and drivers must be correctly attired for the class in question, that attendants be neatly dressed, and horses properly presented. The Committee may, in its discretion, bar any entry or person from entering the ring if not suitably presented to appear before an audience.
- 14. PROTESTS: Any exhibitor lodging a protest must accompany protest with

deposit of \$100.00 and it must be addressed to the Show Secretary, and may be received by a member of the Show Management, or the Show Secretary within 48 hours of the alleged violation, which sum will be forfeited if protest is not sustained. Co-signatures will not be permitted. Each contestant must make his or her individual protest and same must be made within 48 hours of the alleged violation. Protests must be referred to the Show Committee whose decisions shall be final.

- 15. QUALIFICATIONS: If it is ascertained that any exhibitor has made or caused to be made any false statement in regard to any animal, or article exhibited, or if any exhibitor shall attempt to interfere with the judge in performance of his/her duties, he or she will be excluded from competing by exhibiting. COURTESY. Any act of discourtesy or disobedience by exhibitors, riders, drivers, grooms or agents to the JUDGES, OFFICIALS or STAFF shall disqualify their entry and the owner shall forfeit his entry fee and all other charges, including any and all prize money which he may have won at this Show. The Horse Show Committee shall have full power to act in issuing a rule in such cases. Should the act justify it, the Horse Show Committee shall have the power to disbar the offending individual from further competitions and to have him and his entire exhibit removed from the grounds WITHOUT BEING HELD LIABLE FOR DAMAGE OF ANY KIND AND THIS SHALL BE ACCEPTED AS A CONDITION OF ENTRY.
- 16. Out-of-State Horses: A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) is required for all horses from out-of-state. The CVI should include proof of a negative test for Equine Infectious Anemia (Coggin's test) within the last 12 months. The requirement for a negative EIA test is waived for horses from South Dakota. An importation permit number is not required unless specific disease issues arise. Any animal with evidence of contagious, infectious disease will be dismissed from the Fairgrounds immediately. This includes animals showing signs of localized disorders such as ringworm or other dermatophytosis (infectious skin conditions) and warts, as well as systemic disease of the respiratory or GI system.

North Dakota Horses: A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) is not required for North Dakota horses unless disease situations arise which necessitate it. Any animal with evidence of contagious, infectious disease will be dismissed from the Fairgrounds immediately. This includes animals showing signs of localized disorders such as ringworm or other dermatophytosis (infectious skin conditions) and warts, as well as systemic disease of the respiratory or GI system.

- Brand inspection is required on all cattle, horses, or mules leaving the state as per ND Century Code 4.1-73-21. A brand inspector will be available to issue brand inspection certificates to out-of-state exhibitors.
- ALL EXHIBITORS ARE EXPECTED TO READ THE FOLLOWING CODE OF ETHICS AND SIGN A STATEMENT ON THE FORMS INDICATING CONSENT TO THE STATEMENTS IN THE CODE.

IAFE (International Association of Fairs and Expositions) National Code of Show Ring Ethics

Exhibitors of animals at livestock shows shall at all times deport themselves with honesty and good sportsmanship. Their conduct in this competitive environment shall always reflect the highest standards of honor and dignity to promote the advancement of agricultural education. This code applies to junior as well as open class exhibitors who compete in structured classes of competition. This code applies to all livestock offered in any event at a livestock show. In addition to the "IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics," fairs and livestock shows may have rules and regulations which they impose on the local, county, state, provincial and national levels.

All youth leaders working with junior exhibitors are under an affirmative responsibility to do more than avoid improper conduct or questionable acts. Their moral values must be so certain and positive that those younger and more pliable will be influenced by their fine example. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers and absolutely responsible persons who violate the code of ethics will forfeit premiums, awards, and auction proceeds and shall be prohibited from future exhibitions in accordance with the rules adopted by the respective fairs and livestock shows. Exhibitors who violate this code of ethics demean the integrity of all livestock exhibitors and should be prohibited from competition at all livestock shows in the United State and Canada.

The following is a list of guidelines for all exhibitors and all livestock in competitive events.

- All exhibitors must present, upon request of fair and livestock show officials, proof of ownership, length of ownership and age of all animals entered. Misrepresentation of ownership, age, or any factors relating thereto is prohibited.
- Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers, or absolutely responsible persons shall provide animal health certificates from licensed veterinarians upon request by fair or livestock show officials.
- Junior exhibitors are expected to care for and groom their animals while at fairs or livestock shows.
- 4. The act of entering an animal in a livestock show is giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, and/or absolutely responsible person for the show management to obtain any specimens of urine, saliva, blood or other substances from the animal to be used in testing. Animals not entered in an event which culminates with the animal entering the food chain shall not be administered drugs other then in accordance with applicable federal, state and provincial statues, regulations and rules. Livestock shall not be exhibited if the drugs administrated in accordance with federal, state and provincial statues, regulations and rules affect the animals performance or appearance at the event.

If the laboratory report on the analysis of saliva, urine, blood or other sample taken from livestock indicates the presence of forbidden drugs or medication, shall be prima facie evidence or forbidden drugs or medications, this shall be prima facie evidence such substance has been administered to the animal either internally or externally. It is presumed that the sample of urine, saliva, blood or other substance tested by the laboratory to which it was preserved and all procedures as said collection and preservation, transfer to the laboratory and analysis of the sample are correct and accurate and the report received from the laboratory pertains to the sample taken from the animal in questions and correctly reflects the condition of the animal at the time the sample was taken, with the burden on the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to prove otherwise.

At any time after an animal arrives on the fair or livestock premises, all treatment involving the use of drugs and/or medications for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal shall be administered by a licensed veterinarian.

- 5. Any surgical procedure or injection of any foreign substance or drug or the external application of any substance (irritant, counterirritant, or similar substance) which could effect the animals' performance or alter its' natural contour, confirmation or appearance, except external applications of substances to the hoofs or horns of animals which affect appearance only and except for surgical procedures performed by a duly licenses veterinarian for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal, is prohibited.
- The use of showing and/or handling practices or devices such as striking animals to cause swelling, using electric contrivance or other similar practices are not accepted and are prohibited.

- 7. Direct criticism or interference with the judge, fair or livestock show management, other exhibitors, breed representatives, or show officials before, during or after the competitive event is prohibited. In the furtherance of their official duty, all judges, fair and livestock show management, or other officials shall be treated with courtesy, cooperation and respect and no person shall direct abusive or threatening conduct toward them.
- 8. No owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person shall conspire with another person or persons to intentionally violate this code of ethics or knowingly contribute or cooperate with another person or persons either by affirmative action or inaction to violate this code of ethics. Violation of this rule shall subject such individual to disciplinary action.
- 9. The application of this code of ethics provides for absolute responsibility for an animals condition by an owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or participant whether or not he/she actually is instrumental in or had actual knowledge of the treatment of the animals in contravention of this code of ethics.
- 10. The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer or absolutely responsible person to have any disciplinary action taken by the fair or livestock show for violation of this code of ethics and any other rules of competition of the fair or livestock show without recourse against the fair or livestock show. The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent that any proceedings or disciplinary action taken by the fair or livestock show may be published with the name of the violator or violators in any publication of the International Association of Fairs & Expositions, including Fairs and Expositions and any special notices to members.
- 11. The act of entering an animal in a fair or livestock show is the giving of verification by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer or absolutely responsible person that he has read the IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics and understands the consequences of and penalties provided for actions prohibited by the code. It is further a consent that any action which contravenes these rules, and is also in violation of federal, state or provincial statues, regulations, or rules may be released to appropriate law enforcement authorities with jurisdiction over such infractions.

Horses may be ridden or exercised in warm-up or indoor arenas ONLY. Anyone riding or exercising in the cattle tie-outs will be asked to leave the show and forfeit all winnings.


