





2024 INFORMATION:

- 1. The North Dakota State Fair for 2024 will be open to the public at 8:00 a.m.
- 2. Competitions are open to everyone unless otherwise stated.
- 3. During the Fair, the grounds will be kept and equipped to the best of our ability and resources for the comfort of the public.
- 4. A first aid station will be maintained at the Ambulance Station located at Gate E for use in case of accident or illness.
- 5. An information desk will be maintained in the Media Center in front of Commercial I.

The management will consider it a favor if persons will report any mistreatment or extortion practice by any employee of the Fair or concessionaires. DO NOT WAIT until the Fair is over to file a complaint, DO IT AT ONCE!

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS:

- 1. The North Dakota State Fair Board reserves the final and absolute right to interpret these rules and regulations, and settle and determine all matters, questions and differences in regard thereto, or otherwise arising out of, connected with, or incident to the Fair.
- 2. Removal time of exhibits is specified in each department.
- 3. Exhibits not removed or arrangements made for their removal within ten days of close of Fair will become property of the Fair.
- 4. The board reserves the right to reject any entries offered, particularly such as require an unreasonable amount of space.
- 5. Exhibitors are required to give attention to their exhibits, and at the close of the Fair, to attend promptly to their removal.
- 6. The board will carefully guard against extortion in any form practiced on patrons of the Fair. A violation of this rule shall cause forfeiture of contract and money paid and involves expulsion from the grounds as the secretary of the board may direct.
- 7. The board reserves the right to formulate and announce new rules to meet emergencies that may arise later and during the Fair, and to adjudicate all matters arising from the Fair after it is held.
- 8. The board reserves the right to direct and regulate the parking of all automobiles or other vehicles or conveyances within the Fairgrounds and to direct where they shall be driven therein. It may prohibit the running of automobiles in any section of the grounds whenever, in its opinion, common safety demands it.
- 9. The Fair management and board reserve the right to exclude from the Fairgrounds any person or persons whom they may deem undesirable, or who shall violate any of the rules laid down by the management, or who shall otherwise become offensive.
- 10. No rollerblades or bicycles allowed on Fairgrounds.
- 11. Only livestock and/or horse exhibitors will be allowed to have dogs on the Fairgrounds in camping areas only. Under NO circumstances will dogs be allowed south of the barns.
- 12. No refunds of entry fees will be made unless cancellation is received **IN WRITING** (letter, fax or email) by July 1. No refunds will be given on tickets, wristbands or vehicle permits.
- 13. All livestock shows not produced by the North Dakota State Fair must have State Fair Board approval by June 15 for any sponsor they plan to recognize during State Fair.

NO LIABILITY:

- 1. Every possible protection and courtesy will be extended to the public, concessionaires and exhibitors at the North Dakota State Fair, but the board shall not be responsible for any loss of exhibits, animals, or equipment in case of fire, theft, or from loss from any other cause.
- 2. The North Dakota State Fair Board, its agents, servants, and employees shall not be held liable in case of injury to exhibitors, concessionaires, or the public on the grounds or in the buildings from any cause whatsoever while on the grounds of the North Dakota State Fair.
- 3. All entries including livestock, horse, static, etc. are brought to the state fairgrounds and remain under the exhibitor's own risk.

LIVESTOCK EXHIBITOR RULES & INFORMATION

Anyone in violation of Fair regulations may be eliminated from competing at State Fair. - Please read carefully -

INFORMATION REGARDING REGISTERING:

- Entries must be made on the furnished entry blanks or online at
 ndstatefair.fairwire.com <u>online entry is the preferred method</u>.
 All entries need to be filled out properly and given all information
 asked. Write legibly. Be sure to give the name and address of owner
 or owners and division and class numbers in which the animal is to be
 entered, as printed in the premium list.
- Entries will close July 6 at 5pm. Only entries received by the July 6 deadline will receive their passes in the mail, if any were requested. For any entry after the deadline that requested passes, the passes can be picked up at the NDSF office prior to fair or at Gate F during the fair. Entries may be made after the deadline by paying triple the normal fees. Entries will not be received after 5pm on Friday, July 12. Stall requests can be made on entries however are not guaranteed. No alteration in stalls allowed unless permitted by superintendent.
- Entries must specify the name of animal, its age, sex and description, and if purebred, also state breed, registered number. Certificate of registry must be furnished to the superintendent on demand except in case of very young animals where certificates and registry numbers will not be required. Please bring copies of registration papers. Failure to present registration papers may result in forfeit of premiums.
- Animals must be entered in the name of the bona fide owner or owners, except get of sire and produce of dam, and should any prove to be otherwise entered, premiums awarded them will be forfeited to the Fair. Affidavit of ownership may be required and must be produced if demanded.
- No animal will be allowed to enter in more than one division or class except in groups or herds. Exhibitors may not enter more than two entries in any one class number.
- All exhibitors are expected to read the IAFE Code of Ethics.
 Submission of entry implies acceptance of and compliance with these conditions and regulations.
- Canadian exhibitors at par for entry and stall fees, compliments of ND State Fair

EXHIBITOR RULES WHILE ON FAIRGROUNDS:

- Stalls and pens must be kept open for inspection by visitors from 9
 a.m. to 8 p.m. each day. Exhibitors should have a representative in
 charge during those hours.
- All animals competing for premiums must be brought out when called by the superintendent of the department. Failure to do so will result in forfeit of all premiums due such exhibitor.
- All exhibitors are responsible for the welfare of their animals. Exhibitors are expected to provide adequate feed, water, bedding and housing for the comfort of their animals. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to make arrangements for appropriate care if they are unable to be present. We encourage the humane treatment of animals and abuse will not be tolerated. The comfort and safety of the animal must be addressed throughout the show. Non-stressed animals will perform better for the handler. Exhibitors are expected to handle their animals in a gentle and calm manner and not create undue excitement in the vicinity of other livestock or persons.
- Hay, straw, and wood chips will be available on the grounds at a reasonable charge. Cash only, no credit.
- Animals not entered for competition or exhibition will not be allowed in exhibition barns.

LIVESTOCK ARRIVAL PROCESS:

- The State Fair is a livestock exhibition which showcases superior animals. Animals which are not in ideal condition do not represent agriculture at its finest and diminish the public's perception of agriculture. As such, animals exhibiting any condition affecting their health or comfort, in the professional opinion of the inspecting veterinarian, will not be permitted on the Fairgrounds. The State Fair will follow the State Board of Animal Health's requirements should they change from the time of print to the beginning of the fair.
- Before unloading livestock, a state veterinarian must check all
 livestock to ensure health and well-being of all animals exhibiting at
 the ND State Fair. Any animal with evidence of contagious, infectious
 disease will be dismissed from the Fairgrounds immediately. This
 includes animals showing signs of localized disorders such as club
 lamb fungus, ringworm, or other dermatophytosis and warts, as well as
 systemic disease of the respiratory or GI system.
- Depending on the disease, exhibitors may be given the opportunity
 to seek a veterinarian off the fairgrounds for treatment. If properly
 treated, the livestock entry may be approved for readmission if the
 state veterinarian staff sees the treatment as satisfactory and is given a
 written receipt from the offsite veterinarian. The written receipt must
 include the veterinarian's name, contact information, treatment plan,
 and signature.
- Check State Veterinarian Schedule before arrival. See page 15 for schedule
- Additionally, any animal with an obvious physical defect or deformity, including, but not limited to, prolapses, open sores, eye lesions, lameness or other physical injury shall be removed from the Fairgrounds immediately. Animals exhibiting any condition affecting their health or comfort in the professional opinion of the inspecting veterinarian will not be permitted on the Fairgrounds. Animals who are recovering from localized skin disorders will be permitted if (1) there are no open sores, and (2) hair is beginning to grow back (as determined by inspecting veterinarian).

RULES REGARDING THE SHOW:

- Stock must be in the judging ring promptly after being called.
 Exhibitors failing to comply with this rule may be barred from competition.
- Judges need not make awards in classes where competition is lacking.
 In classes where there is but one entry, place will be awarded at the discretion of the judge.
- Only animals that have been awarded first or second place in their proper classes may compete for championship awards. In judging championships, the awards will be made to animals that the judge considers the best type of their breed or class.
- No judge will be allowed to have entries in a division he/she is judging.
- · Establishing a breed:
 - 5 paid entries must be received by entry deadline
 - 5 paid entries must be received for 2 consecutive years
 - 3rd year the breed will be established

ENTRY AND RELEASE TIMES:

No tack or livestock allowed in the barns before Thursday, July 18 at 3pm.

- Beef: Open class beef must be penned by 12 noon Friday, July 19. Release time: 6pm Monday, July 22.
- Sheep: Open class sheep must be penned by 12 noon Friday, July 19. Release time: 2pm Monday, July 22.
- **Swine:** Open class swine must be penned by 11am Tuesday, July 23. Release time: 6pm Saturday, July 27.
- Dairy: Open class dairy must be penned by 11am Tuesday, July 23. Release time: 6pm Saturday, July 27.
- Dairy Goats: Open class dairy goats must be penned by 11am Tuesday, July 23. Release time: 6pm Saturday, July 27.
- Goats: Open class Boer goats must be penned by 11am Tuesday, July 23.
 Release time: 6pm Saturday, July 27.
- Rabbits: Open class rabbits must be penned by 11am Tuesday, July 23. Release time: 6pm Saturday, July 27. ARBA rabbits must be penned by 6pm Friday, July 19.
- **Poultry:** ALL Poultry must be penned 5pm 8pm Friday, July 19. Release time: 6pm Monday, July 22.
- 4-H/FFA Beef and Sheep: Beef and sheep showing in open class and staying for 4-H/FFA showing Sunday must be penned by 4pm on Saturday, July 20– showing Monday must be penned by 1pm Sunday, July 21 to be able to leave at 6pm on the day of their last show.
- 4-H/FFA Beef, Sheep, Swine, Dairy and Goats (animals showing in 4-H/FFA only): 4-H/FFA livestock must be stalled by 11am Tuesday, July 23. Release day is Saturday, July 27. Times vary based on the distance they live from Minot.
- Junior Point Shows (animals showing in point shows only): Beef, Sheep, Goats, Swine must be stalled by 11am Tuesday, July 23. Release time for Beef & Swine is 6pm the day of the show. Release time for Goats & Sheep is after conclusion of show.
- Top of Dakota Show (animals showing in Top of Dakota shows only): Sheep, Goats, Swine, and Rabbits must be stalled by 11am Tuesday, July 23. Release time is 6pm on Saturday, July 27.

SUPERINTENDENTS:

- Superintendents of the various departments will be designated by suitable badges and attire.
- Each superintendent will have full charge of his or her department with authority to select all assistants and helpers, unless otherwise provided, subject to approval of the management or directors.
- All claims and payrolls must be certified by the superintendent and filed with the Fair office.
- Each superintendent must take charge of the books and return same promptly to the secretary's office as soon as each class is judged. No changes will be allowed in the judges' books unless on order of the board. All orders for premiums must be made out and signed by the superintendent and countersigned by secretary before they will be honored.
- It shall be the duty of the superintendent at the close of the Fair to
 furnish a report in detail giving full information on exhibitors and
 entries entitled to special premiums, also give the number of exhibitors
 and entries in each class.
- The superintendent of each division will have charge of the exhibits in his/her division and of the assistants and attendants employed there.
 Requests and complaints should be made through the superintendent.
 Exhibitors should confer daily with the superintendents of their
- The superintendent of each department will have information as to the time and place at which judging will be done. Exhibitors will be expected to secure this information from the division superintendents.

PREMIUMS:

- Cash awards will be mailed September 2024.
- Premiums will be paid as soon as it is possible to check over the records and judge's report.
- · Checks that are issued for premiums must be cashed promptly.
- Awards will be designated by proper colored cards and ribbons as follows: Blue for first, red for second, white for third, pink for fourth, yellow for fifth, green for sixth and purple for championships.
- State Fair has confirmed the intent of all premium sponsors, but assumes no guarantee of their commitment.
- · Judges need not make awards in classes where competition is lacking
- In classes where there is but one entry, placing will be awarded at the discretion of the judge.
- Only animals that have been awarded first or second place in their proper classes may compete for championship awards. In judging championships, the awards will be made to animals that the judge considers the best type of their breed or class.
- Any attempt to show an animal out of its proper division or class shall cause forfeiture to the Fair of all premiums won by the exhibitor.
- Removal of open class animals before 6pm on departure day will
 result in forfeiture of all premiums. Removal of Dairy, Swine, Rabbits
 and Goats before 6pm on the closing day of the Fair will result in
 forfeiture of all premiums, unless given permission in writing by the
 management.

PROTEST:

- All protests must be made in writing within five hours to the management after the award has been made, it being considered that an award is made when the notation of the decision of the judge is entered in the department award book.
- All protests must be accompanied by a deposit of \$25 in the Livestock
 Department and \$10 in all other departments, which shall be returned
 to the complainant if sustained, and if the protest shall not be sustained,
 then said sum shall be forfeited.
- No protest or appeal based upon the statement that the judge or judges are incompetent or have overlooked an animal or article, will be considered by the management or the board of directors.
- Protest must state plainly the cause of complaint or appeal, with specific charges and recital of facts relied upon by the rule violated, naming witnesses and their addresses by whom proof is to be made.
- All questions in dispute or differences not covered by these rules shall be referred to the Governing Board of Directors whose decision shall be final.

DRUG SCREEN POLICY:

- The Drug Screen Policy will be enforced at the 2024 State Fair. Grand and Reserve Champion market beef, swine, lamb and goats will be subjected to a drug screen immediately following completion of judging. This drug screen may include tests for detection of the following: (1) Steroids (2) Tranquilizers (3) Antibiotics (4) Diuretics (5) Sulfas (6) Non-Steroidal Anti-inflammatory Drugs (NSAIDs) (7) Stimulants. Any animal with a positive test will be deemed unworthy and penalized as follows:
 - 1. Disqualification of animal
 - 2. Forfeit of premiums
 - 3. Exhibitor banned from exhibiting any species the following year
- If for some reason an exhibitor has an animal that has been administered any drug within 45 days of the show, the exhibitor must present a veterinarian's signed statement to the specie superintendent at arrival check in. This statement must include:
 - (1) Reason for treatment
 - (2) Antibiotics used plus dosage and frequency
 - (3) Date of last treatment.

- Season passes will be valid once every day of the fair, these may be exchanged for a wristband at the treasurer's office located in the Tile Lobby of the State Fair Center (Wristband void if removed)
- Season passes are available online at www.ndstatefair.com, by phone: 701-857-7620, or at the ND State Fair office. You can also purchase them while entering your entries or at any gate during the fair.

TRAILER PARKING:

- You will need a Livestock Load/Unload pass to enter the fairgrounds with your livestock. All vehicles used to transport livestock and/or RV's must have a valid auto pass. Vehicles without passes will be towed at the owner's expense. Vehicle passes must be requested in advance of the first day of the Fair, and will not be available at the gate. Livestock load/unload passes will be limited to one (1) per family and can be requested on the livestock entry form.
- These passes will only be used to load/unload livestock and tack during entry and release times. Tack stored off grounds can only be unloaded from 6:00AM to 10:00AM and 7:00PM to 9:00PM. A tack train will run from the west lot to the barns (for TACK ONLY) for the convenience of exhibitors. Please call 838-7250 from 6:00AM-10:00AM or 5:00PM-7:00PM for service
- After unloading your livestock, you can park your trailer in the Trailer Parking Lot (see map). If you wish, you can leave your vehicle hooked up. If you choose to unhook, you can park your vehicle in our Free Parking Lot (located east of the grandstand) or park off grounds. If you are camping, you can choose to have this vehicle in your camping spot if preferred, however, you are only allowed to have one vehicle in your camping spot.





IAFE NATIONAL CODE OF SHOW RING ETHICS

Exhibitors of animals at livestock shows shall at all times deport themselves with honesty and good sportsmanship. Their conduct in this competitive environment shall always reflect the highest standards of honor and dignity to promote the advancement of agricultural education. This code applies to junior as well as open class exhibitors who compete in structured classes of competition. This code applies to all livestock offered in any event at a livestock show. In addition to the "IAFE Code of Show Ring Ethics," fairs and livestock shows may have rules and regulations which they impose on the local, county, state, provincial and national levels. All youth leaders working with junior exhibitors are under an affirmative responsibility to do more than avoid improper conduct or questionable acts. Their moral values must be so certain and positive that those younger and more pliable will be influenced by their fine example. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers and absolutely responsible persons who violate the code of ethics will forfeit premiums, awards and auction proceeds and shall be prohibited from future exhibition in accordance with the rules adopted by the respective fairs and livestock shows. Exhibitors who violate this code of ethics demean the integrity of all livestock exhibitors and should be prohibited from competition at all livestock shows in the United States and Canada. The following is a list of guidelines for all exhibitors and all livestock in competitive events:

- 1. All exhibitors must present, upon request of fair and livestock show officials, proof of ownership, length of ownership, and age of all animals entered. Misrepresentation of ownership, age, or any facts relating thereto is prohibited.
- 2. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers, or absolutely responsible persons shall provide animal health certificates from licensed veterinarians upon request by fair or livestock show officials.
- 3. Junior exhibitors are expected to care for and groom their animals while at fairs or livestock shows.
- 4. Animals shall be presented to show events where they will enter the food chain free of violative drug residues. The act of entering an animal in a livestock show is the giving of, consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer and/or absolutely responsible person for show management to obtain any specimens of urine, saliva, blood, or other substances from the animal to be used in testing. Animals not entered in an event which culminates with the animal entering the food chain shall not be administered drugs other than in accordance with applicable federal, state and provincial statutes, regulations and rules. Livestock shall not be exhibited if the drugs administered in accordance with federal, state and provincial statutes, regulations and rules affect the animal's performance or appearance at the event. If the laboratory report on the analysis of saliva, urine, blood, or other sample taken from livestock indicates the presence of forbidden drugs or medication, this shall be prima facie evidence such substance has been administered to the animal either internally or externally. It is presumed that the sample of urine, saliva, blood, or other substance tested by the laboratory, to which it is sent, is the one taken from the animal in question, its integrity is preserved and all procedures of said collection and preservation, transfer to the laboratory and analysis of the sample are correct and accurate and the report received from the laboratory pertains to the sample taken from the animal in question and correctly reflects the condition of the animal at the time the sample was taken, with the burden on the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to prove otherwise. At any time after an animal arrives on the fair or livestock show premises, all treatments involving the use of drugs and/or medications for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal shall be administered by a licensed veterinarian.
- 5. Any surgical procedure or injection of any foreign substance or drug or the external application of any substance (irritant, counter-irritant, or similar substance) which could affect the animal's performance or alter its natural contour, confirmation, or appearance, except external applications of substances to the hoofs or horns of animals which affect appearance only and except for surgical procedures performed by a duly licensed veterinarian for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal, is prohibited.
- 6. The use of showing and/or handling practices or devices such as striking animals to cause swelling, using electrical contrivance, or other similar practices are not acceptable and are prohibited.
- 7. Direct criticism or interference with the judge, fair or livestock show management, other exhibitors, breed representatives, or show officials before, during, or after the competitive event is prohibited. In the furtherance of their official duty, all judges, fair and livestock show management, or other show officials shall be treated with courtesy, cooperation and respect and no person shall direct abusive or threatening conduct toward them.
- 8. No owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person shall conspire with another person or persons to intentionally violate this code of ethics or knowingly contribute or cooperate with another person or persons either by affirmative action or inaction to violate this code of ethics. Violation of this rule shall subject such individual to disciplinary action.
- 9. The application of this code of ethics provides for absolute responsibility for an animal's condition by an owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or participant whether or not he or she was actually instrumental in or had actual knowledge of the treatment of the animal in contravention of this code of ethics.
- 10. The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to have disciplinary action taken by the fair or livestock show for violation of this Code of Show Ring Ethics and any other rules of competition of the fair or livestock show without recourse against the fair or livestock show. The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent that any proceedings or disciplinary action taken by the fair or livestock show may be published with the name of the violator or violators in any publication of the International Association of Fairs and Expositions, including Fairs and Expos and any special notices to members.
- 11. The act of entering of an animal in a fair or livestock show is the giving of verification by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person that he or she has read the IAFE Code of Show Ring Ethics and understands the consequences of and penalties provided for actions prohibited by the code. It is further a consent that any action which contravenes these rules and is also in violation of federal, state, or provincial statutes, regulations, or rules may be released to appropriate law enforcement authorities with jurisdiction over such infractions.



INFORMATION:

- State Fair's on-grounds RV parking spaces will be sold in advance for the 2024 Fair. Payment must be received with this reservation to be held.
- Holding of your camping space is contingent upon receiving your livestock entry form and the purchase of gate admission for the same number of days camping. If no livestock registration form is received your camping space will be moved to the East Lot upon availability in the east lot.
- Electrical services are available on first come, first serve basis only. Electrical services by the barns & west lot are 30 amps. Please be courteous to draw no more than 20 or 30 amps during peak times. Those drawing more than 30 amps will be disconnected without a refund. Circuits will overload and the service will be disconnected. Please bring at least a 100' extension cord to reach electricity adequately.
- Showers are available in the Expo Barn, the Bunny Barn, the Block Bathrooms by the Midway, the State Fair Center, and in West Lot Campground.
- It is the sole responsibility of all persons staying on the Fairgrounds to be informed of weather conditions and to react so they are safe. The State Fair Center is open for inclement weather shelter.

RULES:

- Absolutely **NO** camping spaces will be used for parking of vehicles.
- Campers must have a valid camping permit clearly displayed at all times.
- All vehicles used to transport RVs must have a valid auto pass.
- Any vehicle without a valid vehicle pass will be towed at the owner's expense.
- No exceptions can be made for length of stay; you shall be required to leave at your specific time and date. Violators will be towed
- Only livestock &/or horse exhibitors will be allowed to have dogs on the fairgrounds in camping areas only. Under **NO** circumstances will dogs be allowed south of the barns.
- No gray or black water dumping is allowed on site except by a contracted pumper. Please contact the camping office, located on the Southeast end lower level of the All Seasons Arena, for your pumping and filling needs. Requests must be made by 4:00 PM the day prior for the next day service.
- Quiet time is 11:00 PM to 7:00 AM
- Campers are responsible for picking up their garbage, we need to keep our fairgrounds looking beautiful!



To conform to the Century Code 33-33-02-03, all campers must be at least 10 feet apart on each side, this includes slide-outs. All lots will be painted with a 24' x 35' rectangle to help with the parking process. Campers and tow vehicles must fit inside the square. **No extending into the roadway will be allowed!** Your camper must be backed into your lot as far as you can.

HOW TO ENTER

Entries will close <u>July 6 at 5pm</u>. Our online entry system is the preferred method and can be found on ndstatefair.com. Only entries received by the July 6 deadline will receive their passes in the mail, if any were requested. For any entry after the deadline that requested passes, the passes can be picked up at the NDSF office <u>prior</u> to the fair or at Gate F during the fair. Entries may be made after that day by paying triple the normal fees.

Entries will not be received after 5pm on Friday, July 12.

HOW TO ENTER OPEN CLASS OR JUNIOR SHOWS

- 1. Go to ndstatefair.com
 - a. Under the Exhibit tab, go to your respective category
 - b. Read the guidelines- this will help you figure out what days you will have to be on the fairgrounds, what class to exhibit in, and other rules you will need to know. You can also find these in this handbook.

 - a. Even if you have shown at NDSF in the past, all exhibitors are considered new for the year.

HOW TO ENTER A 4-H OR FFA EXHIBIT:

- 1. These organizations use a different program than Showorks, please contact your county agent or FFA Advisor. They will be able to enter you.
- 2. If you are <u>ONLY</u> entering in 4-H or FFA <u>livestock</u> divisions, please fill out the 4-H/FFA ONLY Exhibitor Stall and Passes Request Form that is located on our website. This will allow you to purchase your passes needed to enter the fairgrounds.
 - If you are entering in an open/junior <u>and</u> a 4-H or FFA show, you do not have to do this form as you can request passes on the Open or Junior Show form through Showorks.
- 3. The same animal can only be shown in the 4-H or the FFA show, not both. However, you can show this animal in the Open and Junior Show.

HEALTH REGULATIONS

*These requirements were accurate as of printing time, but are subject to change should health concerns emerge prior to the Fair

Before unloading livestock, a state veterinarian must check all cattle, sheep, swine, and goats to ensure health and well-being of all animals exhibiting at the ND State Fair. Poultry, rabbits and horses will be inspected after they are penned. Any animal with evidence of contagious, infectious disease will be dismissed from the Fairgrounds immediately. This includes animals showing signs of localized disorders such as club lamb fungus, ringworm, or other dermatophytosis (infectious skin conditions) and warts, as well as systemic disease of the respiratory or GI system. Additionally, any animal with an obvious physical defect or deformity, including, but not limited to, prolapses, open sores, eye lesions, lameness or other physical injury shall be removed from the Fairgrounds immediately. Animals exhibiting any condition affecting their health or comfort in the professional opinion of the inspecting veterinarian will not be permitted on the Fairgrounds. Animals who are recovering from localized skin disorders will be permitted if (1) there are no open sores, and (2) hair is beginning to grow back (as determined by inspecting veterinarian).

See page 6 for more information regarding the livestock arrival process.

NO. 1 - NORTH DAKOTA LIVESTOCK

- Cattle: Cattle will be checked by the State Fair Veterinarian prior to unloading. No early releases.
- <u>Goats:</u> All goats that come to the Fair, with the exception of market wether goats, must have official scrapie identification tags. For goat breeds approved by USDA-APHIS-VS, a 'breed registration tattoo' will be accepted in lieu of a scrapie tag, provided the tattoo is legible and the exhibitor presents a copy of the registration papers listing the current owner. Goats will be checked by the State Fair Veterinarian prior to unloading
- **Sheep:** Sheep will be checked by the State Fair Veterinarian prior to unloading. No early releases. All sexually intact sheep must have an official scrapie tag.
- Swine: Swine will be checked by the State Fair Veterinarian prior to unloading. No early releases.
- <u>Poultry:</u> All birds must bear a leg or wing band and meet one of the following criteria: 1) Originate directly from an NPIP certified flock, 2) Test negative to S. pullorum within 90 days prior to exhibitions, or 3) Have been purchased from an NPIP source and be accompanied by a Poultry Exhibition Statement of Origin form (SRN 60329). Form is available on the North Dakota Department of Agriculture's website . https://ndda.nd.gov/division/animal-health/national-poultry-improvement-plan
- Rabbits: Rabbits will be inspected after they are caged.

NO. 2 - LIVESTOCK FROM OTHER STATES

- All livestock will be checked by the State Fair Veterinarian prior to unloading.
- Certificate of veterinary inspection (CVI) and an importation permit number are required on all food animals from out of state. A CVI is required for horses, but an importation permit is not unless specific disease issues arise which necessitate it.
- Out-of-state livestock must all be officially identified, regardless of age or sex, and will need a certificate of veterinary inspection and permit number from the ND State Board of Animal Health. To obtain the importation permit number, veterinarians should call 701-328-2655. For any livestock being imported from Canada please contact the North Dakota State Board of Animal Health at 701-328-2655 and the USDA APHIS, Veterinary Services at 701-250-4210.



NO. 2 - LIVESTOCK FROM OTHER STATES - SPECIES SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS

- Cattle: No early releases. All out of state cattle for exhibition, regardless of age or sex, must be identified with an official tag which is listed on the CVI prior to entry to North Dakota. A negative Brucellosis test is required for all sexually intact cattle 18 months of age or older from Texas, Idaho, or from certain counties in MT or WY. A negative tuberculosis test within 30 days prior to importation is required for all cattle from Michigan, Texas and California. Calves accompanying a negative dam do not require testing. All bulls over 24 months of age and all non-virgin bulls over 12 months of age must have three consecutive, weekly, negative Trichomoniasis fetus culture tests or one negative PCR test prior to importation unless an exhibition exemption is granted. Contact the ND State Board of Animal Health for complete information.
 - Additional requirements for Dairy Cattle: All dairy breed cattle sixty days of age or older, other than steers and spayed heifers, must be negative to an official test for tuberculosis within 30 days prior to entering North Dakota.
 - Additional requirements for Rodeo/Event Cattle: All cattle used for rodeo or timed events must have a negative bovine TB test within the last 12 months prior to import into ND. Bucking bulls must also have a negative brucellosis test within the last 12 months prior to importation. Please call the ND State Board of Animal Health for importation requirements for Mexican origin (M-branded) cattle.
- Sheep: All sexually intact sheep must have an official scrapie tag. Rams 12 months of age and over must be negative to an approved Brucella ovis test, or the flock of origin must have a negative B. ovis status. A negative B. ovis status is non-transferable from one flock to another for those animals which are sold. Unless sheep are a QR or RR genotype at codon 171 as verified by two blood tests drawn under the supervision of an accredited veterinarian or state or federal veterinarian, the CVI must include the following statement signed by the owner of the flock of origin: "The flock of origin had not been diagnosed as a scrapie infected, source, trace, or exposed flock in the last five years".
- <u>Swine:</u> All swine must be identified with an official ear tag. The following Porcine Epidemic Diarrhea virus (PEDv) statement is required on all CVIs and must be signed by the owner as well as the veterinarian. "The premises the swine are originating from has not had signs or a diagnosis of Transmissible Gastroenteritis (TGE) or Porcine Epidemic Diarrhea virus (PEDv) in the last 60 days."
- **Goats:** All goats that come to the Fair, with the exception of market wether goats, must have official scrapie identification tags. For goat breeds approved by USDA-APHIS-VS, a 'breed registration tattoo' will be accepted in lieu of a scrapie tag, provided the tattoo is legible and the exhibitor presents a copy of the registration papers listing the current owner.
- · Rabbits: A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection is required on all rabbits from out of state.
- <u>Poultry:</u> CVI must list statements or test results relating to Avian Influenza, Avian Tuberculosis, Pullorum-Typhoid, and Exotic Newcastle Disease. All birds must bear a leg or wing band and meet one of the following criteria: 1) Originate directly from an NPIP certified flock, 2) Test negative to S. pullorum within 90 days prior to exhibition, or 3) have been purchased from an NPIP source and be accompanied by a Poultry Exhibition Statement of Origin form (SFN 60329). Form is available on the North Dakota Department of Agriculture's Website https://ndda.nd.gov/division/animal-health/national-poultry-improvement-plan

NO. 3 - BRAND INSPECTION

Brand inspection is required on all cattle, horses, or mules leaving the state as per ND Century Code 4.1-73-21. A brand inspector will be available to issue brand inspection certificates.



DECLARATION OF WEIGHT PROCEDURES:

- The Swine Show will operate under a Declare Your Weight process for market animals as well as crossbred breeding gilts. This means each exhibitor will be responsible for weighing his or her own hogs during the weigh-in period on Tuesday, July 23. The weigh-in period will run from noon until 4pm. Weight cards will be available Tuesday morning for exhibitors to pick up to record their pig's weight and other required information. The cards will be in triplicate form. The first copy must be submitted to 4-H or FFA, the second copy will be turned in to the open class superintendent, and the third copy will be for the exhibitor's records. Required information will be the exhibitor's name; exhibitor's number; pig tag number; whether the animal is a barrow or gilt and market or breeding gilt; and pig weight on the 4-H/FFA card circle indicating in which show the animal will be shown. Use the other card circle if it will be shown in the open and junior show. All weight cards must be submitted to the appropriate superintendents by 4:30pm on Tuesday, July 23. If weight cards are not turned in by the 4:30pm deadline, those animals will not be eligible to show in their respective shows.
- Along with the Declare Your Weight, a weigh-back is required for each of the shows. The top three animals in each class will be weighed during their class to determine if they are eligible to return for the overall drive. If a pig does not weigh within the allotted plus/minus 15-pound weight allowance, it will not receive a placing for that class and will not be eligible for champion/reserve market hog competition. The next pig in the lineup will move up in class and be called to the scale for a weight check.
- Following the weigh-in time period and declaration of weight, the management will determine the splitting of the classes according to the weight distribution and number of animals, with no more than 15 in a group. Class weight breakdowns will be posted.





Entrants must have a sheep background and/or an interest in sheep or wool and be at least 10 years of age. The entrants will be judged on the garment worn, which must be constructed of at least 60% wool and may be purchased or made, and also the presentation of the sheep with the contestant during the show. The garment will be judged on fit, style, attractiveness, and appropriate use of wool while adding elegance to the class. Entrants will participate in individual, personal interviews with the judges regarding general knowledge of the sheep and wool industry and garment construction. Entrants are encouraged to construct their own garments. Entrants must also furnish a blanket for their sheep to wear during this class. A total of 20 points will be available during the judging process. Up to 10 points available on the knowledge and presentation of the sheep and up to 10 points available for the garment, its construction, fit, style, and appropriate use of wool. Out of the 10 points available for the garment, each contestant that constructs their own garment will automatically be awarded 2 points of the 10 possible points in this area.

RULES REGARDING ENTRIES:

- Entries will close July 6 at 5pm. Our online entry system is the preferred method and can be found on ndstatefair.com. For a step-by-step please see page 12.
- Only entries received by the July 6 deadline will be listed on the show program and receive their passes in the mail, if any were requested. Any entry after the deadline that requested passes, the passes can be picked up at the NDSF office <u>prior</u> to fair or at Gate F during the fair.
- Entries may be made after the deadline by paying triple the normal fees. Entries will not be received after 5pm on Friday, July 12.
- Youth may show their animal in either 4-H or FFA, not both. They may show both in the open shows.
- When filling out entry form, remember that a "cock" or "hen" is a bird over one year. A "cockerel" or "pullet" is a bird under one year. A trio is one male and two females of the same breed and age. "Pens" are three-of-one kind listed. Birds entered as singles are not allowed to be entered as trios and vice versa. A bird may not be entered in more than one class. There is no limit to the number of entries per class.
- All entries must be made in the name of the exhibitor and must be bona fide property of the exhibitor.
- The superintendent may elect to use bands for identification and to re-classify birds at his discretion.
- The awarding of premiums will be by comparison. The premium paid and the ribbon to be placed on an exhibit will be left to the discretion of the judge.

RULES REGARDING SPECIE SCHEDULE & BARNS:

- Birds are released Monday, July 22 at 6pm. Early withdrawal may result in premium forfeiture.
- Livestock trailers and livestock vehicles will be required to park off grounds. Camper vehicle can park in assigned camping lot with appropriate pass. All vehicles used to transport livestock and/or RV's must have a valid auto pass. Vehicles without passes will be towed at the owner's expense. Vehicle passes must be requested in advance of the first day of Fair, and will not be available at the gate. Livestock load/unload passes will be limited to one (1) per family and can be requested on the livestock entry form. These passes will only be used to load/unload livestock and tack during entry and release times. Tack stored off grounds can only be unloaded from 6:00AM to 10:00AM and 7:00PM to 9:00PM.
