2024 INFORMATION:

- 1. The North Dakota State Fair for 2024 will be open to the public at 8:00 a.m.
- 2. Competitions are open to everyone unless otherwise stated.
- 3. During the Fair, the grounds will be kept and equipped to the best of our ability and resources for the comfort of the public.
- 4. A first aid station will be maintained at the Ambulance Station located at Gate E for use in case of accident or illness.
- 5. An information desk will be maintained in the Media Center in front of Commercial I.

The management will consider it a favor if persons will report any mistreatment or extortion practice by any employee of the Fair or concessionaires. DO NOT WAIT until the Fair is over to file a complaint, DO IT AT ONCE!

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS:

- 1. The North Dakota State Fair Board reserves the final and absolute right to interpret these rules and regulations, and settle and determine all matters, questions and differences in regard thereto, or otherwise arising out of, connected with, or incident to the Fair.
- 2. Removal time of exhibits is specified in each department.
- 3. Exhibits not removed or arrangements made for their removal within ten days of close of Fair will become property of the Fair.
- 4. The board reserves the right to reject any entries offered, particularly such as require an unreasonable amount of space.
- 5. Exhibitors are required to give attention to their exhibits, and at the close of the Fair, to attend promptly to their removal.
- 6. The board will carefully guard against extortion in any form practiced on patrons of the Fair. A violation of this rule shall cause forfeiture of contract and money paid and involves expulsion from the grounds as the secretary of the board may direct.
- 7. The board reserves the right to formulate and announce new rules to meet emergencies that may arise later and during the Fair, and to adjudicate all matters arising from the Fair after it is held.
- 8. The board reserves the right to direct and regulate the parking of all automobiles or other vehicles or conveyances within the Fairgrounds and to direct where they shall be driven therein. It may prohibit the running of automobiles in any section of the grounds whenever, in its opinion, common safety demands it.
- 9. The Fair management and board reserve the right to exclude from the Fairgrounds any person or persons whom they may deem undesirable, or who shall violate any of the rules laid down by the management, or who shall otherwise become offensive.
- 10. No rollerblades or bicycles allowed on Fairgrounds.
- 11. Only livestock and/or horse exhibitors will be allowed to have dogs on the Fairgrounds in camping areas only. Under NO circumstances will dogs be allowed south of the barns.
- 12. No refunds of entry fees will be made unless cancellation is received **IN WRITING** (letter, fax or email) by July 1. No refunds will be given on tickets, wristbands or vehicle permits.
- 13. All livestock shows not produced by the North Dakota State Fair must have State Fair Board approval by June 15 for any sponsor they plan to recognize during State Fair.

NO LIABILITY:

- 1. Every possible protection and courtesy will be extended to the public, concessionaires and exhibitors at the North Dakota State Fair, but the board shall not be responsible for any loss of exhibits, animals, or equipment in case of fire, theft, or from loss from any other cause.
- 2. The North Dakota State Fair Board, its agents, servants, and employees shall not be held liable in case of injury to exhibitors, concessionaires, or the public on the grounds or in the buildings from any cause whatsoever while on the grounds of the North Dakota State Fair.
- 3. All entries including livestock, horse, static, etc. are brought to the state fairgrounds and remain under the exhibitor's own risk.



STATIC EXHIBITOR INFORMATION:

- Entries must be made on the furnished entry blanks or online at ndstatefair.fairwire.com, online entry is the preferred method. All entries need to be filled out properly and given all information asked.
 Write legibly.
- Entries will close July 6 at 5pm.
- Use a separate entry blank for each department (i.e. fine arts & crafts, needlework, etc.) Please label each exhibit with division and class number, as well as exhibitor's name and contact information.
- All exhibitors are expected to read the IAFE Code of Ethics.
 Submission of entry implies acceptance of and compliance with these conditions and regulations.
- Canadian exhibitors at par for entry and stall fees, compliments of ND State Fair
- Those picking up exhibits on the last Saturday of the fair, must pay for gate admission.

JUDGING/PREMIUMS:

- Judges will not act in any partial way toward any of the exhibits or exhibitors. Judges will not be allowed to have entries in a division where he/she is the judge.
- Any person who shall attempt to interfere with or influence the
 judges while in the discharge of their duties, or shall at any time on
 the grounds of the Fair use contemptuous or abusive language to any
 judge, or within the hearing, in consequence of any awards made by
 him, shall forfeit his right to any premiums he/she may have won, and
 may be excluded from the grounds. Judges are requested to report any
 infraction of this rule.
- · Cash awards will be mailed September 2024.
- Premiums will be paid as soon as it is possible to check over the records and judge's report.
- Checks that are issued for premiums must be cashed promptly.
- Awards will be designated by proper colored cards and ribbons as follows: Blue for first, red for second, white for third, pink for fourth, yellow for fifth, green for sixth and purple for championships.
- State Fair has confirmed the intent of all premium sponsors, but assumes no guarantee of their commitment.
- · Judges need not make awards in classes where competition is lacking
- In classes where there is but one entry, placing will be awarded at the discretion of the judge.



SUPERINTENDENTS:

- Superintendents of the various departments will be designated by suitable badges and attire.
- Each superintendent will have full charge of his or her department with authority to select all assistants and helpers, unless otherwise provided, subject to approval of the management or directors.
- All claims and payrolls must be certified by the superintendent and filed with the Fair office.
- Each superintendent must take charge of the books and return same promptly to the secretary's office as soon as each class is judged. No changes will be allowed in the judges' books unless on order of the board. All orders for premiums must be made out and signed by the superintendent and countersigned by secretary before they will be honored.
- It shall be the duty of the superintendent at the close of the Fair to furnish a report in detail giving full information on exhibitors and entries entitled to special premiums, also give the number of exhibitors and entries in each class.
- The superintendent of each division will have charge of the exhibits in his/her division and of the assistants and attendants employed there.
 Requests and complaints should be made through the superintendent.
 Exhibitors should confer daily with the superintendents of their divisions.
- The superintendent of each department will have information as to the time and place at which judging will be done. Exhibitors will be expected to secure this information from the division superintendents.

PROTEST:

- All protests must be made in writing within five hours to the management after the award has been made, it being considered that an award is made when the notation of the decision of the judge is entered in the department award book.
- All protests must be accompanied by a deposit of \$25 in the Livestock
 Department and \$10 in all other departments, which shall be returned
 to the complainant if sustained, and if the protest shall not be sustained,
 then said sum shall be forfeited.
- No protest or appeal based upon the statement that the judge or judges are incompetent or have overlooked an animal or article, will be considered by the management or the board of directors.
- Protest must state plainly the cause of complaint or appeal, with specific charges and recital of facts relied upon by the rule violated, naming witnesses and their addresses by whom proof is to be made.
- All questions in dispute or differences not covered by these rules shall be referred to the Governing Board of Directors whose decision shall be final

Deadline for entry form is July 6, 2024. Open class crops and gardens are shown in the 4-H Hall in the ND State Fair Center. There are two shows, beginning Friday, July 19 and Tuesday, July 23, to ensure fresh displays.

ENTRY FEE: None

WHO MAY ENTER:

• Any North Dakota resident — farmer, gardener or seed grower may be an exhibitor, but no person shall be permitted to enter more than one exhibit in any one class, nor shall members of the same family living on the same farm or household be permitted to compete in the same class. Exhibits must have been raised and owned by the person entering them.

HOW TO ENTER:

- Entries must be listed on an official entry form by July 6. Due to our computer entry program, we encourage you to mail your entry form in early. Please clearly print name, address, department, division, and class on the entry form, as well as on the sample being exhibited. There is also an online entry option that can be found on ndstatefair.com.
 - Variety should be listed with the name of each sample. Entry blanks are available in this book. Use separate entry blanks for each department (i.e. Fine Arts, Needlework, etc.); you may photocopy the entry form. A gate pass for an auto, driver and one passenger, good for the necessary times and dates of entry and change-over only, will be provided. Abuse of this pass will result in discontinuation. Entries must be received by entry deadline to qualify for this pass. The any other crop/produce class in various sections is included to make provision for exhibiting other named crop/produce which are less commonly grown. All crop/produce in a given class competes with each other for places but will be judged on the basis of individual merit with respect to the particular crop/produce.

DROPPING OFF:

• Exhibits may be mailed to the ND State Fair or brought to the 4-H Hall. The Fair management is not bound to take entries made after noon Thursday, July 18 for the first show and after 11am on Tuesday, July 23 for the second show. See special information governing show period for vegetables and garden produce.

JUDGING CRITERIA:

- At judging ribbons will be attached, except the special information governing the second show period for vegetables and garden produce. Instructions on size of exhibits are given under each division. Follow these closely; exhibits of less than the required amount will not be considered for premiums. Treating entries with oil chemicals or processing in any way injurious to the exhibit is not permitted. The judges are instructed not to award premiums to entries unfit for the show or those incorrectly named.
 - This a Produce Show: only high quality material should be exhibited. The show management reserves the right to reject any exhibits which are determined undesirable. 4-H and FFA Pure Seed members should make duplicate exhibits if they wish to enter open class.
 - Return of samples: Exhibits may be picked up between 7 p.m. and 9 p.m. on the last day of each show. After 9 p.m., they will be disposed of. Exhibits will be returned to the exhibitor at exhibitor's own expense if request is made before the close of the show.
 - The Fair reserves the right to color any sample. This will not injure the growing qualities of the sample, but is a precedent followed by all leading Fairs in the country. The show management will exercise reasonable precaution with all items but will not be responsible for loss of or mixture of samples. All exhibits must remain in place for each show as specified. Ribbons must remain on the exhibits during the entire show. All exhibits will become the property of the Fair unless claimed by 9 p.m. Saturday, July 27.
- Blue ribbon winners of the First Show or members of the same farm or household may not re-enter that a same class for the Second Show. Exhibitors are required to collect their own containers at the end of each show period in which they have exhibited.

DIVISION A - GRAIN & FORAGE BUNDLES

To make small grain, grasses, and millet sheaves entered for seed production: Select uniform high quality plants. Spread the grain plants out in a sheltered area and allow to dry for one day. Strip off all leaves, taking care not to break the straw in handling. Form a core of 30 to 40 stems, then place the other stems around the core to form a sheaf 7-9 inches in circumference (around) at a point halfway between the heads and the butt. Tie the bundle firmly in three places, using cord which will not cut the straw. Form the crown (heads) in a rounded shape by moving the core up and down. Cut off the butt squarely and hang the sheaf with heads down until exhibited.

To make alfalfa and sweet clover sheaves entered for seed production: Use same guidelines as for forage production; select stalks showing maximum seed development.

To make a sunflower sheaf: The entire plant should be shown with the leaves removed.

To make a forage sheaf: Select the leafiest types to be found in the field and cut close to the ground. Do not strip a single leaf or branchlet from the stem as forage should retain its color and leaves. In making up show bundles, select those individual stems that have retained the most and best leaves with their color. Make bundles from 3 to 5 inches in diameter (across) or 9.4 to 11 inches in circumference (around) tied securely once at a point 1/3 from the base, and tied a second time loosely once about halfway up to prevent spreading. Sheaves measuring under 9.4 inches in circumference will be disqualified. Corn, Sudan, Sorghum and Millet sheaves shall be tied three times at uniform spacing.

DIVISION C & D - VEGETABLES & FRUIT PRODUCE

- Vegetables must have been grown by the exhibitor in North Dakota in 2024. Exhibits must consist of that part of the plant commonly used for human consumption.
- An auto and one passenger pass, good for the necessary times and dates of entry and change-over only, will be provided for this year's Fair. Abuse of this pass will result in discontinuation for 2024. The gate at the NW end of the Fairgrounds and the door at the NW corner of the Theater shall be unlocked and manned for your delivery and pick-up convenience.
- There will be two show periods for this division

DIVISION C - VEGETABLES

Vegetables will be judged on the following criteria: uniformity, maturity, correct number and preparation, full size, good color and shape, firm, free of damage by insects, disease or mechanical injury.

Beans: Exhibit 12 pods with calyx (stem).

Beets: May wash, tops one to one and one-half inches long, leave tap root. Exhibit six beets.

Broccoli: Over three inch head diameter, remove all leaves, head and stock six to eight inches long. Exhibit one head.

<u>Cabbage</u>: Do not peel excessively, leave layers of sound green outer leaves, but loose leaves should be removed. Trim root smooth with the base of the leaves. Exhibit one head.

Carrots: Top one to one and one-half inches long, may wash and leave tap root. Exhibit six carrots.

Cauliflower: Trim leaves even with outer edge of head, remove older leaves, cut stem 1" below base of the head. Exhibit one head.

Celery: Trim leaves uniformly, cut roots even with stock. Exhibit one plant.

Cucumbers: Wipe clean, leave half inch stem.

<u>Dill</u>: Trim to a four inch stem. Exhibit six, seed bearing heads tied together at 1" from the base.

Eggplant: One inch of stem attached. Exhibit one specimen.

Garlic: One inch stem, trim root to one inch of bulb. Exhibit six garlic.

Kohlrabi: Cut root off at base. Cut off all leaves to within approximately one and one half inches of the bulb. Exhibit three kohlrabi.

Lettuce (head): Trim older outer leaves, remove root. Exhibit one plant

Muskmelons: Stems removed, exhibit one melon.

Onions (red, yellow, and white): Remove all dead layers of skin, clean but do not wash, leave one to one and one-half inch stem; however, do not injure bulb, trim root to 1/4 inch. Exhibit six onions.

Onions (green): Remove outer covering on bulb, trim tops so overall length is six to eight inches, trim root 3/4 inch of bulb. Exhibit six onions.

Parsnips: Cut tops one to one and one-half inches, leave tap root. Exhibit three parsnips.

Peas: 12 pods with calyx (stem).

Peppers: Leave one-half to one inch stem. Exhibit three peppers.

Potatoes (red, white or russet): Brush or wipe off with soft cloth, can be washed but do not scrub. Exhibit six potatoes.

Radishes (globe or icicle): Leave one-half inch top growth and tap root. Exhibit six radishes.

Rhubarb: Trim so two inches of leaf blade remains attached to stalks, do not remove ends. Tie six stalks at each end and center. Exhibit one bunch.

Rutabaga: Cut tops to one to one and one-half inches, leave tap root. Exhibit three rutabagas.

Squash, other: Normal harvest size, leave stem, exhibit one.

Summer Squash: Zucchini type, maximum eight inches long, leave stem. Exhibit three.

Sweet Corn: Do not remove husks, trim silk to within one inch of top of husk, shank one to two inches long. Exhibit three ears.

Swiss Chard: Use three plants, trim older outer leaves, leave root, wrap root in wet paper and cover with plastic.

Tomatoes: Remove stems. Exhibit six larger fruits or 12 cherry types.

Turnips: Cut tops one to one and one-half inches, leave tap root. Exhibit three turnips.

Watermelon: One to one and one-half inch stem, exhibit one melon.

DIVISION D - FRUITS

All fruits shown must be raised by the exhibitor in North Dakota and proof of the same may be required.

All fruit classes: remove stems except strawberries. Grapes should be displayed in clusters.

- Only one entry may be made in any one class from any one family except for Any Other class, where exhibitors may enter three varieties or pots
 in this class.
- List variety and name. For size of planters, measure pot diameter at the top, edge to edge.
- Class numbers 1-102 are for the first show, class numbers 101-202 are for the second show.
- Blue ribbon winners of the First Show or members of the same farm or household may not re-enter that a same class for the Second Show. Also, if first show results in a ribbon, the same plant cannot be re-entered in the second show
- The superintendent in charge will see that all plants on exhibition are properly cared for during the time of the Fair, but will not be responsible for loss or injury.

RULES ON DROPPING OFF:

- Entry tags will be mailed in advance of the first show so exhibitor can tag their own exhibits.

- All reasonable care will be given to exhibits entered. The North Dakota State Fair and the Taube Museum of Art will not be responsible for any loss or damage during transit, judging or exhibition.
- · All entries must have names and addresses attached to the back lower left-hand corner, unless otherwise specified.
- You may photocopy the entry blank in this booklet, or additional entry blanks may be obtained from the ND State Fair office at the Fairgrounds, P.O. Box 1796, Minot, ND 58702. You may also download additional entry forms at www.ndstatefair.com.
- All reasonable care will be given to exhibits entered. The North Dakota State Fair and its staff will not be responsible for any loss or damage during
 transit, judging or exhibition. Submission of entry implies acceptance of and compliance with these conditions and regulations. Unless exhibits

RULES ON DROPPING OFF:

• Any article, having been properly entered, can be forwarded by mail or prepaid express to Dept. 111, ND State Fair, PO Box 1796, Minot, ND 58702. The ND State Fair will place the goods on exhibition. The management however, will not be responsible for any breakage of glass or loss of any article. A self-addressed label and return postage must accompany the exhibit for return. The ND State Fair will assume no responsibility for return of exhibit with insufficient postage. Send complete list of articles contained in package. Mailed exhibits must reach the Fair Office by 5 p.m. Thursday, July 11. Entries mailed must be shipped with substantial packing in boxes strong enough for return shipment.

JUDGING CRITERIA:

- An acceptance committee will review all entries for compliance with the rules. Only those entries meeting the rules, as written here, will be judged and displayed. If too many entries are received for the allotted display area, the acceptance committee will choose entries to be displayed. All entries that meet the rules, as written here, will be judged. All prize-winning entries will be displayed. Only original works of art will be eligible.
- Judges need not make awards in any category where competition is lacking.

RULES ON PICKING UP:

• Exhibits will not be released before 6pm on the last day. Exhibits may be picked up on Saturday, July 27 between the hours of 6pm and 8pm, or on Sunday, July 28, between the hours of 10am and 2pm. Ticket stubs must be shown before release. Those picking up exhibits on Saturday, July 27 must pay gate admission.

SPECIAL RULES:

- Oils must be framed, dry and ready to hang. Use ONLY screw eyes and wire
- Watercolors, prints, and drawings must be matted, backed with cardboard or foam core, covered with acetate or shrink wrap and ready for hanging. It is not recommended that glass be used, is at owner's risk. Pieces must have proper and sturdy hanging system. (Ex. Attach wire to back tabs. Use strapping tape to secure tabs.)
- Sculptures of excessively fragile type or enormous size will not be accepted.
- Ceramics, pottery, mosaics: no plaster objects will be accepted.
- Only original works are eligible (no commercial molds or designs).
- Textiles: No kits will be accepted. Hand-woven or loomed, original batik, block printed and/or hand decorated will be accepted. Each item must be labeled for identification. Art-tex or Tri-Chem will not be accepted.
- · Crafts no plastic model kits will be accepted.

Professional: refers to those whose work is produced primarily for the purpose of selling; or who have a diploma, certificate, degree or three or more years of art school training; or teach in their art media.

<u>Amateur</u>: refers to those who do not derive income directly from art. The amateur generally does his art for the pleasure involved and has had little or no art training.

<u>People's Choice</u>: There will be a box for folks to vote for their favorite Fine Art entry in classes A-C. The announcement of the "People's Choice" will be Saturday afternoon. Ten dollars cash prize will be awarded to the winning entry.

Best of Division: One Best of Division Rosette will be awarded in each division of this department. (See each division for amount of award.)

- Please clearly print name, address, department, division, and class on the entry form, as well as on the sample being exhibited. Exhibits cannot be accepted unless an entry blank is properly filled out and on file with the Fair Office prior to the closing date for entries
- Use separate entry blanks for each department (i.e. flowers, needlework, etc.).
- Competition is open to North Dakota residents only.
- Entry form must include the title of each exhibit being entered. Attach entry information to work with tape.
- Please enter exhibit under person's name who made it
- All reasonable care will be given to exhibits entered. The North Dakota State Fair and the Taube Museum of Art will not be responsible for any loss or damage during transit, judging or exhibition. Submission of entry implies acceptance of and compliance with these conditions and regulations.
- Unless exhibits comply with these rules, they will not be accepted.

RULES ON DROPPING OFF:

- Any article, having been properly entered, can be forwarded by mail or prepaid express to Dept. 114, ND State Fair, PO Box 1796, Minot, ND 58702, where it will then be placed on exhibition. The management however, will not be responsible for any breakage of glass or loss of any article. A self-addressed label and return postage must accompany the exhibit for return. The ND State Fair will assume no responsibility for return of exhibit with insufficient postage. Send complete list of articles contained in package. Mailed exhibits must reach the Fair Office no later than 5pm **Friday, July 5.**
- No entries will be accepted after deadline. Judging will begin Wednesday, July 17 at 1:30pm.
- All entries must be in a sack, package, box, etc., for protection and return.

JUDGING CRITERIA:

- The judges are instructed not to award prizes unless the articles are deemed of real merit, even though they may be the only entry in the class.
- Any article exhibited in prior years at the North Dakota State Fair is ineligible to show

1. MOUNTING

- No more than eight exhibits on a tag board.
- Lettering should be well planned, balanced and attractive.
- Same quality of work should be mounted together in any one display.
- Student's names should be visible on display.
- Only one entry tag per board is needed.
- Please remove all county fair ribbons.

2. DISPLAY

- Select the BEST work for display and not the work of the entire class, e.g., 20 students draw sketches: only the best should come to the Fair, other students may enter another project.
